Keep it with you at all times – it's your trusted companion for a strong start!


FUN FACT:

- Szeged is renowned for its iconic paprika – the bright red spice that lends a distinctive flavor to local dishes. It is also regarded as the city where Albert Szent-Györgyi first extracted vitamin C from paprika peppers.

Enrollment

Grading System and Credits

LOCAL CREDITS

As Hungary is a member of the European Union, Hungarian universities are part of the European Higher Education Area. This means that credits and degrees earned in Hungary are transferable to other European institutions. To support this, an **ECTS (EUROPEAN CREDIT TRANSFER SYSTEM)** equivalent is used at all Hungarian universities. The minimum credit requirement is 180 credits for a Bachelor's degree, 120 for a Master's degree, and 240 for a doctoral degree.

Student Life



National Holidays

Hungary has several national public holidays. On these days, all shops are closed and public transportation operates on a limited schedule, so make sure to do your shopping in advance.



- On October 23, Hungarians mark the Memorial Day of the 1956 Revolution, commemorating the uprising against communist oppression.
- November 1 is All Saints' Day, a day to remember lost loved ones, when families place flowers and candles on graves.
- December 24 is Christmas Eve, when it is traditional in Hungary to gather and celebrate around the Christmas tree. The holiday continues on December 25 and December 26, which are official public holidays.



- **March 15** is the Memorial Day of the 1848–49 Revolution for Independence, celebrated with music, commemorative speeches, and the wearing of special ribbons in the national colors of the Hungarian flag.
- Easter is of great significance in Hungary and is celebrated on a different date each spring.
- **May 1**, known as May Day or Labor Day, is a public holiday marking the arrival of spring.
- The Christian holiday of Pentecost is also a bank holiday, occurring on the seventh Monday after Easter Sunday.
- **August 20** is Hungary's State Foundation Day, featuring fireworks and day-long festivities.





Health Insurance

Accidents and illnesses can happen, and sometimes it may become necessary to get medical assistance during your stay in Hungary. With health insurance, your medical expenses are partially or fully covered by the insurance company if you become sick or injured. It is also mandatory to have valid health insurance in order to receive your residence permit.

PRIVATE HEALTH INSURANCE (GENERALI STUDIUM)

Students can have a Generali Studium Health Insurance policy arranged through the University. For certain programs, the tuition fee already includes the health insurance fee – please check with your faculty for details.

GOVERNMENT-FUNDED HEALTH INSURANCE (TAJ CARD)

Holders of a valid **Student ID Card** or **Temporary Student ID Certificate** are entitled to health care services under Act CXXII of 2019 on the Entitlements to Social Security Benefits and on Funding These Services. They are therefore eligible to receive a social security card (known as a "TAJ card"). With a TAJ card – Hungary's national health insurance card – scholarship holders can access public health care services free of charge, not only for emergencies or urgent care, but for general medical needs as well.

Application

You can apply for a TAJ card at the Stipendium Hungaricum Office by booking an appointment. Please note that you can only apply once you have obtained your permanent residence permit. Processing takes at least 2-3 weeks, so it is important to submit your application as soon as possible..



You will need the following documents:

- A copy of **your passport**
- Approved **residence permit certificate** (in Hungarian)
- A copy of your **residence permit**
- **Accommodation Reporting Form** (a certificate confirming your current accommodation in Hungary, with a QR code)

Student ID Card

A Student ID Card or Temporary Student ID Certificate entitles students to enjoy various discounts for many services and at numerous venues.

TEMPORARY STUDENT ID


If you are in Szeged to study on a mobility program such as Erasmus or IISMA and are staying for a shorter period, you may benefit from a Temporary Student ID, which is issued much faster than the permanent one. Please make sure your student status is active in the Neptun system, then present your passport at the **Student Services Office** (10 Ady Square).

PERMANENT STUDENT ID CARD

If you are staying for a longer period, you can apply for a permanent Student ID Card. After completing your **academic registration** and making sure your student status is active in Neptun, you will need to visit the **Government Office** to obtain the so-called **NEK Card Data Sheet** (NEK adatlap), which serves as proof of registration in Hungary's National Unified Card System.

Documents Needed for Official Card Data Sheet

- Letter of admission or student status certificate
- ID/passport
- Residence permit (for non-EU or non-EEA citizens)
- Registration card from the Immigration Office (for EU or EEA citizens)

At the Government Office, your photo will be taken, and you will receive your official Card Data Sheet (NEK adatlap) required for your permanent Student ID Card. You must submit this Data Sheet to the Student Services Office (HSZI) either in person or by email (hszi@hszi.u-szeged.hu). Please do this as soon as possible, as it takes about one month for the Government Office to issue your plastic Student ID Card.

Bank Account

Hungarian banks offer a comprehensive range of services, including account management, currency exchange, pension funds, insurance, and mortgages.

In most cases, you will need a valid residence permit and a Hungarian address card to open a bank account.

You will also need a Student ID Card or a valid passport.

Tax ID Number

Students awarded Hungarian state scholarships (such as Stipendium Hungaricum or the Scholarship for Christian Young People) are required to have a Hungarian tax ID number in order to open a bank account. To obtain a tax ID number, you need to fill in a Hungarian form and submit it in person to the Tax Office (NAV) together with the following documents:

- Your letter of admission
- Your passport

After you receive your tax ID number (printed on the certificate issued by the Tax Office), make sure to return to the Student Services Office and inform them of your tax number.

Public Transport



Szeged is easy to get around on foot, but you can also use buses, trolleybuses, and trams. Tickets can be purchased at kiosks throughout the city, or even on board by contactless payment. To take a bus, tram, or trolleybus, you need the right ticket, which must be validated on the vehicle. Daily, weekly, and monthly passes are also available, and university students are entitled to discounts with their Student ID Card.

KLEBELSBERG LIBRARY AND ARCHIVES (JÓZSEF ATTILA STUDY AND INFORMATION CENTER, TIK)

The Klebelsberg Library is Central Europe's largest university library, located in the Study and Information Center (TIK). The Library and Archives hold nearly 3 million documents, with about 350,000 available in open reading areas across four floors, organized by subject. A range of e-services is also available for your convenience: you can browse the online catalogue, place storage requests from home, or renew your books online. Wi-Fi is provided, and the ever-helpful library staff are ready to assist you until late evening on weekdays and weekends, for both general and electronic services.
